

# Mahurangi District Council

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### NOTE:

This is live document and changes may be made as new or better information or processes comes to light.

## Preamble:

The Establishment of a District Council is made in anticipation of the Mahurangi District becoming a self-governing area under the Higher Laws (Common Law, Natural Law and God's Law).

It is not our intent to mimic the current government portfolios, of which there are seventy six, but to remove completely any portfolio that is not relevant to New Zealand Society. Government is not the creator of society or the approver of any aspect of that society, so, in the National Assembly (when established) most of the portfolios on the government website will disappear.

The Portfolios in this document are laid out as being the main portfolios that we, as a District, need to consider and prepare for moving forward. The descriptive content of these portfolios is not a final statement but are given for the Council's consideration. Amendments may be made or additional portfolios added if supported by two thirds majority of the councillors.

All appointments to the Council are made under the authority of the Interim District Governor and are interim appointments which must be vacated once there is within the district 5% of the eligible voting public as supporters of the Mahurangi Declaration and the Constitution.

At 5% we will have passed the threshold of the current electoral system for representation in parliament, not that representation is the goal of The People's Jurisdiction, it is not, but in the current political climate a body of support of at least 5% cannot be ignored.

Support may be shown by:

## Portfolios:

### Communications

National communications infrastructure is a National Assembly function, however the District must prepare for continuation of local communications in the event of a loss of that infrastructure or a civil emergency.

To that end a Citizen Band radio network shall be established within the District. The frequency band will be AM since this has a longer range than FM. FM band is effectively line of sight. Key elements in the network will be people who have properties at a high elevation. With a range capability, with the proper antennas, of 20-30Km these properties will become communications hubs to relay information from other hubs to people within range of the hub.

Other Citizens in low lying areas or vehicle mounted systems may be limited to 8-10 Km range, depending on their setup.

The District should prepare for total communication losses occurring with increased frequency of the next few years as the Earth's magnetic field reduction is expected to diminish in the lead up to a magnetic pole flip.

Faraday cages and bags are recommended for electronic equipment.

5G transmission will be banned in the District.

Landline telephones should be included in every household.

Dumb phones are preferred to keep prevent unwanted GPS tracking of the phone's location, unwanted Bluetooth ID of a phones location and interaction with other phones, or monitoring of conversations and internet surfing.

Wired internet is preferable to wireless broadcast. The District shall have an active policy to remove wireless EMF transmitters from homes and businesses. Alternatives such as closed loop induction or infrared LED systems are available.

Local Post Offices should be established in each community with the ability to transport letters and documents to other local post offices. People would then collect mail from the Post Office. This may seem like a step backwards in time, but if our electronic systems do go down then the only available means of communication may well become by physical transport. even by horseback.

### **Community:**

This portfolio includes all aspects of facilities for the community, such as libraries, art galleries, community halls, play grounds and the activities that take place within these facilities.

Commercially the council will encourage a shift from the supermarket style of provision of goods and produce to a market style system of individual shop owners.

The council will encourage and facilitate the creation of community gardens and markets.

Nationwide chains of shops that 'corner the market' shall be discouraged in favour of locally owned outlets for goods and services. This includes the shopping mall type facility.

### **Construction:**

All construction, whether domestic or commercial, in the District shall be under the authority of the District Council.

Property owners are free to build whatever structures they wish on their own property provided the construction or the finished structure does not interfere with any neighbours use and enjoyment of adjacent properties.

The objective of the building code to be developed is to minimise interference in design and the burden on the owner to comply with expensive and unreasonable codes or regulations.

Architectural Engineers (persons or practises that cover both architectural design and structural/civil engineering) shall be licenced to operate within the District by the District Council.

The Architectural Engineers shall have total responsibility and liability to design a construction in accordance with New Zealand and international standards.

Builders will be licenced to operate within the district, either as a sole trader individuals or a company. Builders shall have total responsibility and liability to build in accordance with the design in every respect.

The Architectural Engineers shall oversee the construction and ensure the builders sign off on the design instructions and issue a completion certificate to the owner once the work is finished.

If it is found that the designers or builders of a construction failed to undertake the work in accordance with the design, or that the design was flawed or not in accordance with standards, or materials used that were known to be of inferior quality, then that designer or builders will have licences revoked and may never again practise or build within the District.

### **Defence:**

In accordance with The People's Jurisdiction all persons on attaining the age of 18 years shall be required to undergo military or Civil Defence training.

On completion of the national commitment there will be a requirement to give service locally as and when required for the defence of the District or in support of humanitarian objectives within the District such as natural disasters. The service period shall be for a period of five years from the date of release from National commitments. On completion of the five year period a militia member may re-sign for a further five year period.

Militia members shall be paid on a part time basis for hours on duty.

Militia's will be formed with divisions at population centres throughout the District.

Each militia member will be issued with equipment applicable to his/her National training, if civil, then appropriate equipment, if military then appropriate arms. The militia member is responsible to maintain the equipment or arms in good and proper order at all times.

### **Education:**

Establish facilities (schools) for teaching.

Recruit and certify teachers for the district's schools.

Formation and implementation of a curriculum for education, starting with pre-school levels and progressing through to seventh form level.

Ensure that all teaching is established truth as best we know it to be.

The objective of the curriculum must be to ensure all students have a sufficient level of literacy and understanding in reading, writing and arithmetic as well as a good understanding of New Zealand history and customs.

Critical Race Theory and gender redefinition will be banned with the District.

Review and confirm that all teaching material is confirming God's and Natural Law, is unbiased and equitable teaching, providing generally acceptable points of view even if those points of view are different from each other.

### **Energy:**

Electricity will remain the main source of energy until technological advances bring an alternative form, whatever that may be.

Dependence on a national infrastructure is discouraged and local energy (off grid) electrical generation is to be encouraged.

Energy centres are to be set up in towns and localities where that centre, with appropriate back-up systems, will power some or all of a local community. Individual properties may be powered by their own natural energy system.

Commercial scale natural energy projects must have environmental acceptance and lifetime procedures, which means that the cost, build, operation and eventual decommissioning will not adversely affect the environment and the eventual decommissioning is allowed for in the build estimates.

Large scale wind farm projects will not be approved.

Sources of natural Energy include:

Electrical potential difference systems (Etheric Energy).

The Districts Energy portfolio is established to facilitate the installation of energy systems by individuals and to ensure the chosen system is constructed and operates in a manner that does not impact upon neighbouring properties, physically, optically or audibly.

The Council is aware of energy systems that have already been developed but not yet available for general use. Transmission systems such as Tesla Towers will be implemented to distribute electrical energy nationally.

## **Environment:**

The philosophy of Climate Change / Global Warming / Greenhouse Gases is a mechanism to profit from unnecessary activities in support of an agenda. The climate of the earth naturally undergoes changes on a cyclic basis measured in decades and centuries. The single major influencer of the climate on earth is the sun. All of the activities of man are but a drop in the bucket in as far as its effect on the climate is concerned.

However, it behoves Man as a good steward of the bounties of nature to ensure in all his activities, to the best of his abilities, having regard for the purpose of any changes, that he does no harm, causes no loss or inflicts no injury on a scale that may not be recoverable.

The whole concept of Carbon monitoring and taxation is nothing but a scheme to generate income for corporate interests. It has zero effect on the environment and is actually detrimental to the quality of life of the inhabitants, plant, bird, animal or human. Carbon monitoring will cease and all taxation / legislation to monitor and control activities based on their Carbon footprint or production will be revoked.

Any form of construction or alteration of the natural order of the land or sea, rivers and lakes must have an environmental assessment completed.

It shall be reviewed and assessed by competent persons.

The object of the review is to permit where possible, not deny, the development for which the application is made, but in that permission to ensure relevant controls are in place to meet the environmental concerns.

Businesses that use fresh water from rivers or streams must have the intake for water downstream of the outlet for waste water from the plant.

Disposal of waste by landfill is banned in the District.

Shops and outlets shall be responsible for the disposal of the container or wrapping of any product sold by that outlet.

The use of plastics shall be minimised and the use of glass and wood based containers encouraged.

Systems for the total recycling of all waste will be encouraged.

1080 poisoning, organophosphate chemicals, or similar chemicals and the use of toxic sprays is banned within the district.

Aerial spraying at any altitude over the District of any chemical or particle deemed to be harmful to life or the environment, or intended to alter weather patterns, is banned.

Chemical companies producing cleaning solutions that contain environmentally or humanly toxic chemicals, will pay a tax of 100% of the retail price of the cleaner. The District will publish a list of brands and products that fall into this category.

### **Finance:**

The principles of National Economic Security and Reformation Act (NESARA) shall be followed in the District.

A trust shall be formed which has as its trustees the members of the Council who are portfolio holders. A private banking institution utilising Family Banking principles shall be formed under this trust which shall be responsible for:

1. Receipt of the Tithe from businesses (10% of net profit)
2. Receipt of the voluntary tithe from wage and salary earners (10% of net income)
3. Receipt of Road User Charges for vehicles garaged in the District.
4. Receipt of 5% sales tax on new items sold within the district from retail outlets (excluding food, water, medicines, and domestic energy). This is to be held in trust for the National Assembly or used on maintenance of infrastructure that will be the responsibility of the National Assembly.
5. Disbursement of Tithes at 50% to Health and Community needs within the District and 50% to the District for the maintenance of facilities, local roading, footpaths, parks, gardens, libraries, etc.
6. The retail outlet for any product containing environmentally or humanly toxic chemicals shall be responsible for the collection of the tax at point of sale. All revenues from this tax will be allocated to projects promoting the environmental wellbeing of the District.

Income tax shall be abolished in the District.

Property rates shall be abolished.

Usury on financial transactions shall be unlawful.



The principle of The Family shall underpin every decision and action the Council takes. To that end the economy shall be moved to base all costs on the income provided by one member of the family, with the other having the management of the family as their primary duty. All outgoings for the household must be sustainable by that one income.

Whilst the New Zealand dollar remains a viable means of exchange it shall be used for all commerce within the District. In parallel with the use of the Dollar the District shall implement a barter currency system in accordance with the document “The Mahurangi Exchange”.

### **Health:**

Establish Health Centres throughout the District with the focus on Natural Healing modalities and promotion of lifestyle and dietary philosophies that encourage and engender good health through individual personal responsibility.

Preference is to be given to Natural Healing protocols using natural materials freshly grown or obtained from nature. All remedies must publish a full and complete list of components or ingredients. Medicines manufactured by chemical means by pharmaceutical companies must not contain any chemical that is a known toxin or harmful agent which may be processed by the body to produce a known toxin or harmful agent.

All pharmaceuticals should be considered as a procedure of last resort in medical treatment.

Ensure all health practitioners are certified to practise in the District.

All practitioners must stand under the Common Law fundamental premise of Do no harm, Cause no loss, Inflict no injury.

Reticulated potable water must not contain additives such as Fluoride, graphene or any manufactured nanoparticle. Potable water shall be supplied to private residences free of charge. Access to potable water reservoirs shall be strictly controlled. Systems designed for the delivery of fluoride or other chemicals shall be locked out and may only be opened by the holder of this portfolio or his deputy.

## **Housing:**

The decision on the style and size of a house is the right of the owner of the land who is to be the occupier, provided that the completed house does not negatively impact any of the neighbouring properties.

Housing that is intended for rental properties must obtain the approval of the community in which the housing estate is to be built.

Development projects that involve the clearing of land and establishment of streets and footpaths must have the approval of the community surrounding the development and must accommodate an appropriate area or areas for community parks and gardens. Development must include the establishment of trees and public facilities.

The old principle of the “Queens Chain” which was twenty two yards above spring high water, is to be maintained in the district. The public must be free to walk the full length of the foreshore if they so desire.

Fore-dune areas that extend more than twenty two yards above spring high water may not be built on, except for boardwalks to enable access to the beach.

## **Justice:**

Maintenance of the Peace within the District.

Appointment and oversight of the position of Interim Chief Justice for the District (the District Attorney).

Appointment and oversight of the position of Interim Sheriff for the District.

Approval of the selection of Sheriff’s Deputies throughout the District.

Appointment of Community Court Judges for which there will be one judge selected from the Community Leaders (the Hundreds) for every Community (The Thousand).

Appointment of High Court Judges from among the Community Representatives (Leaders of Ten Thousand) in the Regional Court System.

Definition and implementation of local ordinances where necessary and where requested by the people affected by the ordinance.

There shall be no prisons or detention centres within the Mahurangi District.

The sentencing principles of the Constitution / The People's Jurisdiction shall be applied in every case.

### **Manufacturing:**

Business engaged in the manufacture of products are to be encouraged and small to medium sized businesses (CMEs) should dominate the commercial landscape.

The regulatory framework for the establishment of businesses must be kept to a minimum.

Large businesses that monopolise sectors of the economy are discouraged in favour of locally owned businesses.

### **Primary Production:**

This portfolio covers agriculture, hydroponics, livestock farming and fisheries.

Small scale gardening and farming projects are to be encouraged.

Lifestyle block owners are encouraged to engage in some form of agricultural or livestock farming so that all lifestyle blocks contribute to the domestic economy as well as provide for their own families.

Larger farming or agricultural holdings must be owned by local native people. Corporations that have large land holdings throughout New Zealand or internationally for farming or agriculture will not be permitted to operate within the district.

The use of fertilisers is to be minimised and the use of natural methods of making the ground fertile are to be given priority. Fertiliser use must be supported by proper scientific studies that clearly identify the need for adding manufactured elements to the farmland.

The principle of "lying fallow" is to be encouraged. Allowing a field to be filled as nature herself provides is how nature replenishes the natural balance of the earth. Lying fallow is usually allowed for one whole year in every seven years.

Pine forests should be harvested in bands along the contours of the land to prevent excessive run off and loss of soil. All waste timber cuttings and residue must be removed entirely. This is all to be chipped for use elsewhere.

Immediately this is cleared the ground must be seeded and fast growing low shrubs planted to quickly build up the plant and grass cover of the land. The land must be left fallow for a minimum of two years before replanting in commercial timber.

The same principle extends to the fishing industry which will have extensive areas of ocean and seabed that cannot be touched by any means. This would be a protected area of a length on average of one kilometre for every ten kilometres of foreshore from the high water mark to the one hundred metre contour.

### **Transport:**

The District shall be responsible for the maintenance of local or secondary roadways within the District.

The State Highways shall be maintained by the National Government.

Road user charges for conveyances registered in the District shall be payable to the District.

Alternative energy sources and low impact fuel engines are encouraged, however, that fact that a vehicle is electrically powered is not enough to say it is environmentally friendly. All electric or hybrid vehicle manufacturers must account for the environmental damage caused by separate elements that make up the vehicle. For example, Lithium batteries.

Where the urban conditions are suitable tramways operated by electric, steam or water means shall be constructed.

All public transport shall be free of charge.

A Licence to operate a Conveyance will be issued by the district and will be a lifetime licence. Photo renewal for a minimal fee is to be made every ten years.

Conveyances garaged within the District are to be recorded in the District. A number plate will be issued where the left hand side has three letters designating the District and a five character alphanumeric identifier.

Coastal Transport is to be encouraged with small cargo vessels under sail as primary propulsion. New build vessels to a shallow water design similar to the Dutch Barge or English Scow.
